

Van Gogh Museum

Tickets

Museum's admission fee is €19. Tickets are available online. A limited number of tickets are available for each starting time. Book in advance to make sure you don't miss out.

- At the Van Gogh Museum there are no exhibition fees. With an online ticket you can visit both the permanent collection and the exhibitions on view. All visitors need a ticket with a start time to have access to the museum.

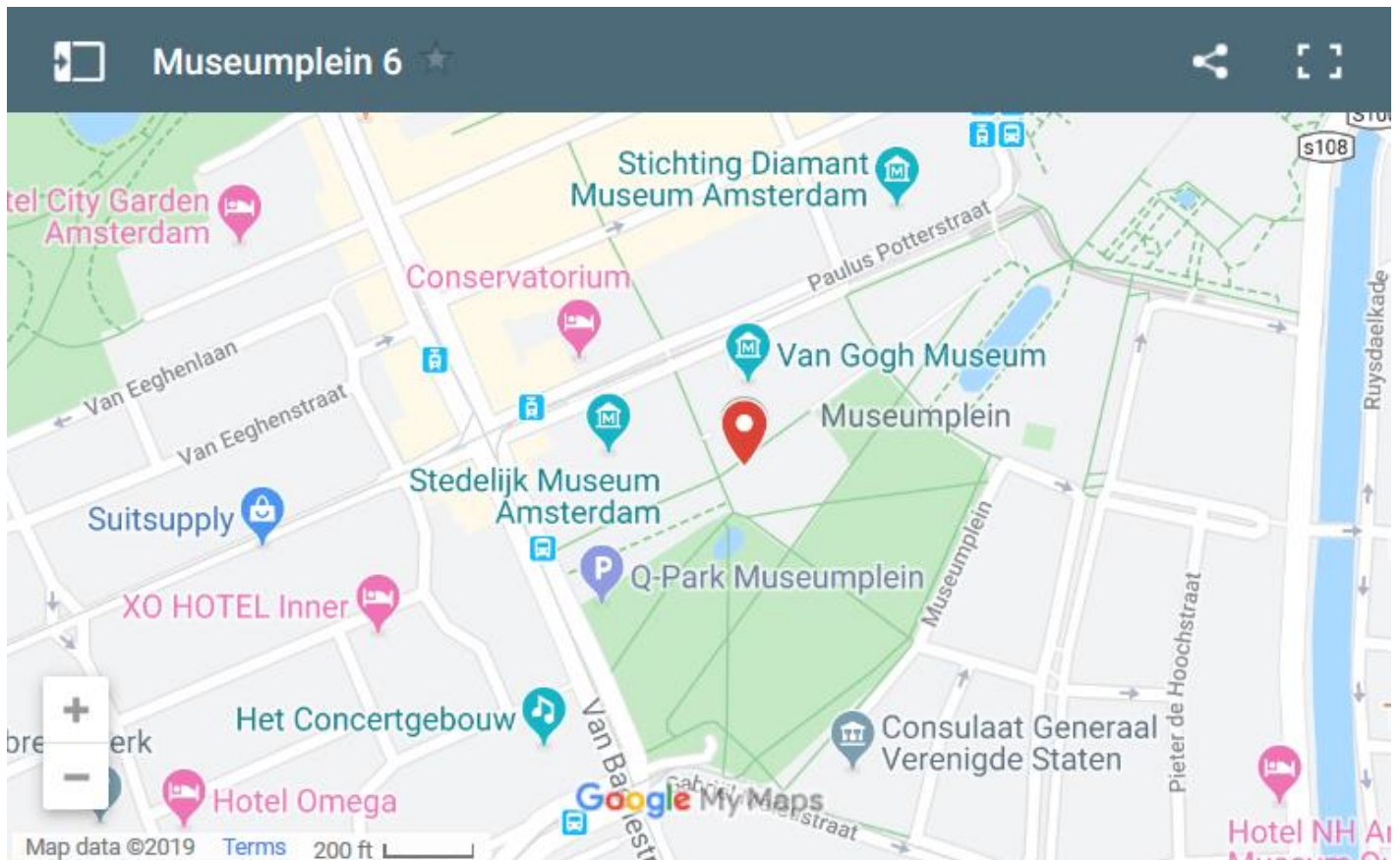
Ticket prices

Address and Route

The Van Gogh Museum is located at the Museumplein in Amsterdam. Getting to the museum is easy by public transport, bicycle, car or coach.

Public Transport

The nearest stops are Van Baerlestraat (tram 2, 5 or 12) or Museumplein (tram: 3, 5 or 12, bus: 347 or 357).

From Amsterdam Central Station

- Tram 2 or 12.
- Tram 11: change at Leidseplein to tram 2, 5 or 12.
- Metro 52 (Noord/Zuid route) until De Pijp station, change to tram 3 (direction Zoutkeetsgracht) or tram 12 (direction Central station).
- Bus 347, direction Uithoorn.
- Bus 357, direction Kudelstaart.

Opening Hours

What are the museum's opening hours? The museum is open daily. Have a look at all opening hours.

- The average visit to the museum lasts 1 hour and 15 minutes. This allows sufficient time to properly explore the permanent collection. Many visitors spend a total of approximately 2 hours at the museum.

Best hours to visit

- Tip: visit the museum from 9 am to 11 am or after 3 pm. The busiest times are between 11 am and 3 pm.
- Please note: last admission is 30 minutes before closing time. Tickets are available months in advance.

- Do you already have a ticket, yet without multimedia guide? Multimedia guides are also available at the multimedia desk in the museum on the day of your visit.

Family guide

- Are you visiting with children? We have a special family guide, too. Experience Van Gogh together, tailored to each person's age. It is designed for families with children aged between 6 and 12 and it is available in Dutch and English.
- Order your adult multimedia guide now and once you arrive at the museum, pick up your family guide at the multimedia desk.

House Rules

We are dedicated to ensuring that all visitors enjoy every moment of their time at the museum. But we also need to take good care of our unique collection, and that's why a selection of museum regulations apply.

Cloakroom

- The museum has a cloakroom where you can leave jackets, umbrellas, small bags up to A4 size and small rucksacks (daypacks and school backpacks). Jackets and handbags are allowed in the museum, but visitors are obliged to leave rucksacks, umbrellas and larger backpacks and items in the cloakroom. There are no lockers at the museum.
- Luggage
Our cloakroom is unfortunately unable to accommodate large rucksacks and bags, (wheeled) suitcases and other luggage or large items such as prams and folding bikes.
- If you have items with you larger than A4 size, you may be refused entrance to the museum. Please leave your baggage at your hotel or keep it in storage at one of the many luggage service points around the Museum square.

Mobile telephone

- Please consider other visitors and limit the use of your mobile telephone wherever possible.

Food & drink

- For refreshments during your visit, please visit our museum café Le Tambourin. Food and drink are only permitted in the museum café, as well as at the bar during Vincent on Friday events. Food and drink are not permitted in the museum or in the exhibition spaces.
